

### THE IP ATTACHÉ PROGRAM

The Intellectual Property (IP) Attaché Program was established to improve IP systems and assist U.S. stakeholders in other countries. Operating across five continents, IP attachés are diplomats with IP expertise assigned to U.S. embassies and consulates throughout the world.

The IP attachés work closely with USPTO headquarters, the International Trade Administration's Foreign Commercial Service, and other federal agencies. They provide technical assistance and training to IP offices worldwide, and advocate for improvements to IP policies, laws, and regulations abroad. This includes direct and indirect advocacy, for example:

- · Raising issues with foreign government officials,
- Providing training on IP law, enforcement, and administration.
- · Conducting public awareness programs, and
- Presenting and explaining U.S. government positions.

#### **Protecting Intellectual Property**

#### Overview

Several general principles are important for effective protection of intellectual property (IP) rights in the European Union. First, it is important to have an overall strategy to protect your IP. Second, IP may be protected differently in the European Union than in the United States. Third, rights must be registered and enforced in the European Union under local laws. For example, your U.S. trademark registrations, design or utility patent titles will not protect you in the European Union without further administrative procedures in the corresponding Member State or at local levels.

Most **copyrighted works** created in the United States will be automatically protected in the European Union from the moment of creation or publication according to international agreements. However, the extension of protection will vary according to the laws of each Member State. Protection against unauthorized use will vary depending on the national laws of each country.



### Micro entity status

- 75% off most patent fees
- Low cost submission to establish filing date
  - Provisional application filing fees:
    - \$140 small entity
    - \$70 micro entity
- Micro entity certifies that he/she:
  - Qualifies as a small entity (less than 500 employees);
  - Has not been named as an inventor on more than four previously filed patent applications




### Inventor and entrepreneur resources by state





