

Erasmus+ in school education

• Erasmus+ offers the opportunity to schools and other organisations active in the field of school education to organise learning mobility activities and cooperation projects for school pupils and staff.

- Primary schools
- Secondary schools
- Local and regional authority



Types of activities in Key Action 1 for schools

Staff mobility

- Job shadowing (2 365 days)
- Teaching or training assignments (2 365 days)
- Ocurses and training (2 30 days)

Learner mobility

- Short-term group mobility (2 30 days)
- Short-term individual mobility (10 29 days)
- Long-term individual mobility (30 365 days)

Other supported activities

- Invited experts (2 60 days)
- Hosting teachers and educators in training (10 - 365 days)

A network of Erasmus+ schools

Erasmus+ aims to build a network of European schools linked together through exchanges of pupils, teachers and staff, as well as knowledge, practices and ideas.
