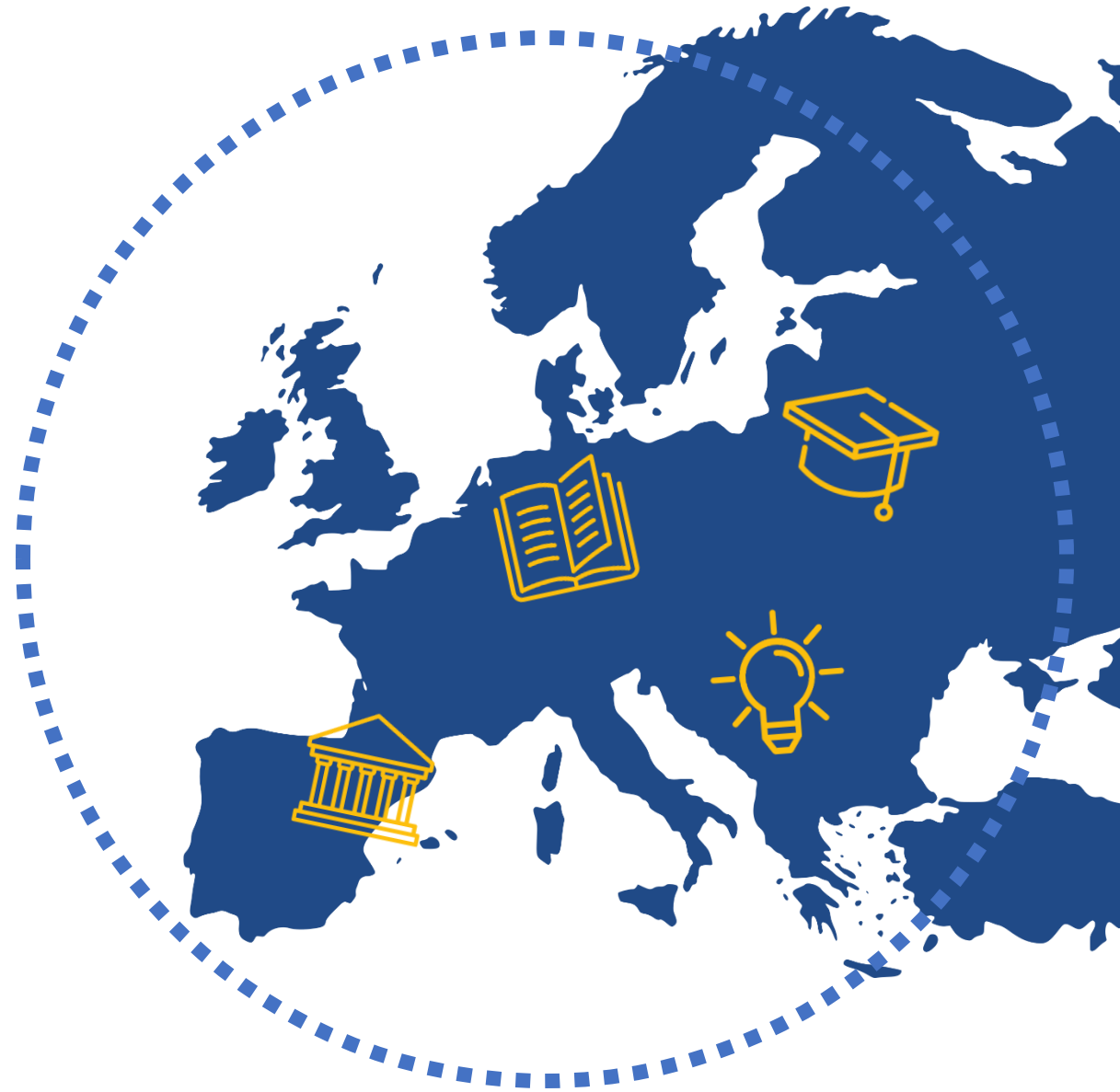

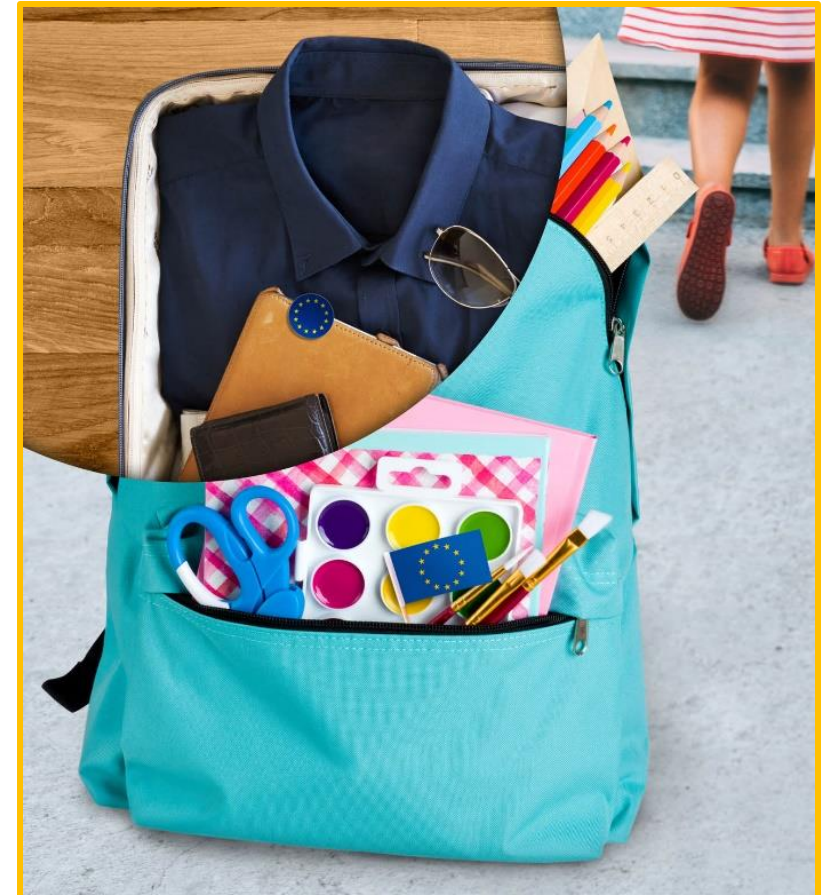

Erasmus+ in school education

- Erasmus+ offers the opportunity to schools and other organisations active in the field of school education to organise learning mobility activities and cooperation projects for school **pupils** and **staff**.
- Primary schools
- Secondary schools
- Local and regional authority



Types of activities in Key Action 1 for schools

Staff mobility

- Job shadowing (2 - 365 days)
- Teaching or training assignments (2 - 365 days)
- Courses and training (2 - 30 days)

Learner mobility

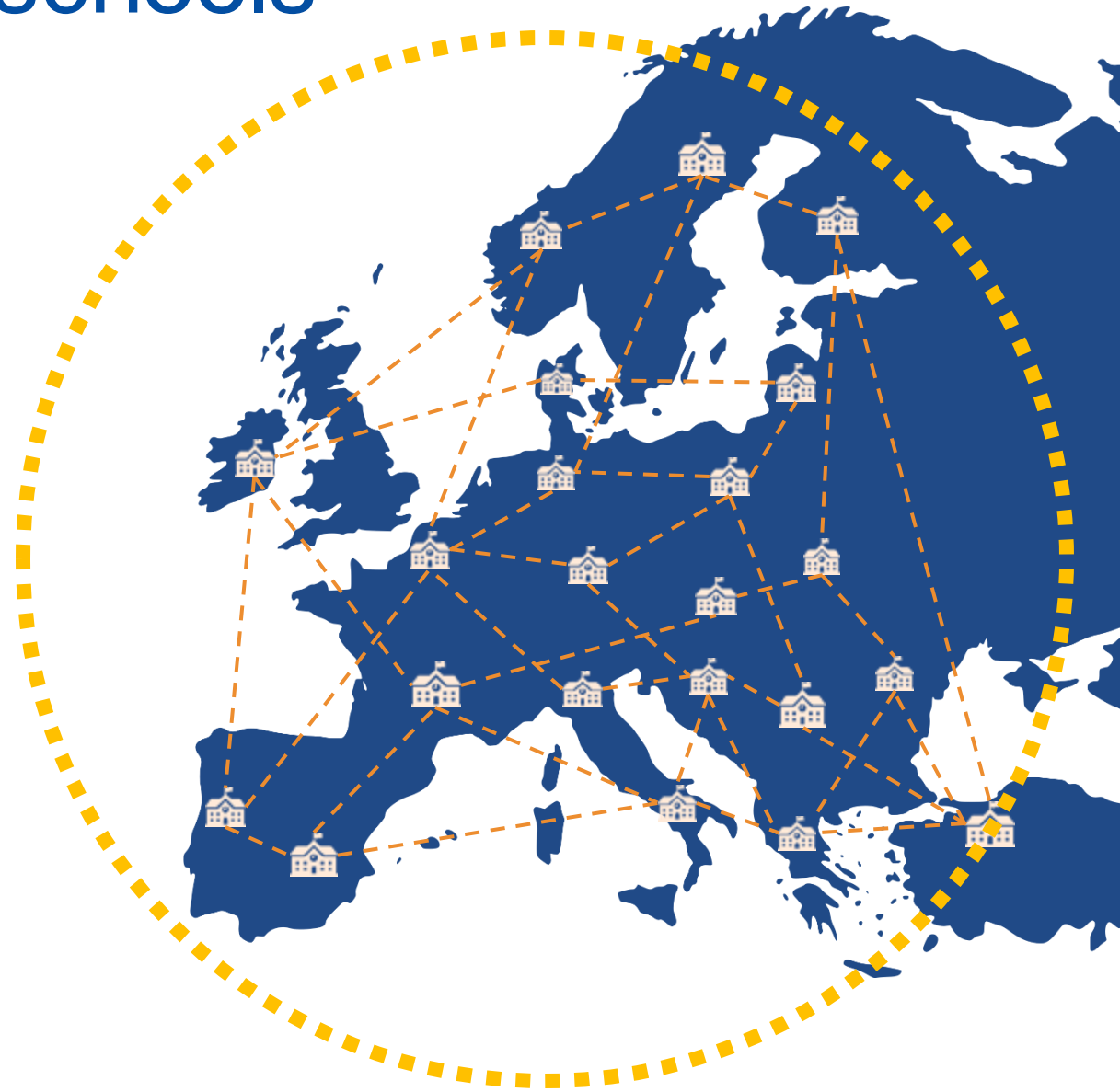
- Short-term group mobility (2 - 30 days)
- Short-term individual mobility (10 - 29 days)
- Long-term individual mobility (30 - 365 days)

Other supported activities

- Invited experts (2 - 60 days)
- Hosting teachers and educators in training (10 - 365 days)

Erasmus+ aims to build a **network of European schools** linked together through exchanges of pupils, teachers and staff, as well as **knowledge, practices and ideas.**
